MENDING WALL

THEME

- 1. The Mending Wall" by Robert Frost is a poem of the physical barrier of the wall representing the psychological or symbolic barrier between two human beings.
- 2. The wall causes an alienation and separation between the two people.
- 3. The wall represents two view points of two different persons, one by the speaker and the other by his neighbour. Not only does the wall act as a divider in separating the properties, but also acts as a barrier to friendship& communication.
- 4. The speaker in "Mending Wall " describes the yearly practice of mending the wall as a sort of "out-door game" he plays with his neighbour. Although it is the speaker who reaches out to his neighbor to initiate this year's repairs, the neighbor insists of having boundaries between people.
- 5. The narrator mentions how the neighbour seems to be walking not only in the thick shade of woods and trees, but in actual "darkness", implying ignorance or inhospitable sentiments.
- 6. The narrator concludes with the line-
- "Good fences make good neighbours"

Meaning: It is better for people to mind their own business and to respect the privacy of others.
